FEATURED GENRE: UKRAINIAN INDIE

Though Ukraine features heavily in contemporary news cycles, its prolific musical offerings rarely take center stage. A recent push to strengthen the national and cultural identity has led to a resurgence of folklore-inspired popular music. Innovative neo-folk guartet DakhaBrakha creates "ethnic chaos" based on traditional Ukrainian melodies. Meanwhile, folk-pop group YAGÓDY explores a more electronic direction, blending Ukrainian sounds and Balkan motifs with dance beats and synthesizers.
